Our Barrow delegation attended a great District Convention in Greensboro on **April 20**. 21 of our 26 delegates and 4 of our 11 alternates were present. After elevating the 4 alternates to delegate-voting status, we were just 1 shy of 100 percent voting strength. We were the second largest delegation after Walton County (27).

District Chairman Brian Burdette (Greene) and the other 7 incumbent officers were re-elected for 2-year terms, including our Mike Pentecost as Asst. Treasurer. Mike and I were fortunate to retain our State Committee memberships for 2013-2015 out of a possible 13 at-large positions. I hope to be reappointed as District Rules Chairman.

Note – The 2013 State Convention in Athens will occur before our next monthly meeting.

We had a great meeting last month with great attendance. We approved a new operations spending resolution to get us through the end of 2013. Appointments to our work committees were made and approved. We heard from Buckhead Young Republicans Chairman Gregg Williams who is running for GAGOP Second Vice-Chair. New State Party officers will be elected at the State Convention in May. Barrow School Board member Lynn Stevens also gave her thoughts on the Common Core problems facing our public schools.

Our next regular monthly meeting will be Monday, **May 20, 2013** at 7:30 PM in the Winder Woman's Club. Our speakers will be State Reps. Terry England and Regina Quick. ELI MANSOUR

"Ben Bernanke testified before Congress, and Republicans grilled him for what Senator Bob Corker (R., Tenn.) called his "dovish" policies on inflation. Bernanke pointed out that inflation has run at an average of 2 percent on his watch, lower than that under almost any postwar Fed chairman. Not since the mid -1960s have prices been more stable. The Republicans should have adopted a different line of criticism. The Fed had it within its power to keep nominal spending growing at a stable rate, which would have helped to steady the economy. Instead, over the last five years, it first let nominal spending drop at the fastest rate since 1938 and then kept it growing very slowly. The results have been a sharp recession, a weak recovery, and a lack of certainty about the path of monetary policy. Inflation is not the only way a central bank can fail." (National Review)

PROPOSED RESOLUTION TO BE CONSIDERED AT OUR MAY 20, 2013 MONTHLY MEETING

FAVORING PARTISAN ELECTIONS FOR COUNTY OFFICIALS AND SCHOOL BOARD OFFICIALS

WHEREAS, the members of the Barrow County Republican Party believe that voters are better prepared to exercise their civic duty when they have as much information about candidates as possible; and

WHEREAS, Political Party affiliation is a key indicator about the political philosophy of the candidates and elected officials running for and currently holding important positions of power and influence in our county, and:

WHEREAS, as a Political Party, Barrow County Republicans should continue to build on previous gains and promote conservative Republican principles in all current elected partisan offices which impact our society and county;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the County Committee of the Barrow County Republican Party calls on our State Representatives and State Senator, to oppose any legislative proposals to establish non-partisan elections for Sheriff, Tax Commissioner, Coroner, Clerk of Superior Court, Chief Magistrate, and Probate Court Judge in Barrow County;

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED, the County Committee of the Barrow County Republican Party calls on our State Representatives and State Senator to oppose any legislative proposals to establish non-partisan elections for all elective positions on the Barrow County Board of Education and the Barrow County Commission.

PROPOSED RESOLUTION TO BE CONSIDERED AT OUR MAY 20, 2013 MONTHLY MEETING

IN SUPPORT OF MARRIAGE

WHEREAS, for centuries marriage has been defined and legally designated in Western civilization as the union of one man and one woman; and

WHEREAS, a marital union of one man and one woman is the best environment to raise and nurture any children produced by such a union; and

WHEREAS, a marital union of one man and one woman is the best environment to raise and nurture any children adopted by such a union; and

WHEREAS, there are attempts to expand the legal designation of "marriage" to include unions between homosexuals; and

WHEREAS, the reasoning behind calling unions between homosexuals as "marriage" also supports the same for unions involving more than two marital partners;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the County Committee of the Barrow County Republican Party calls on our State Representatives, State Senator, and other State officials to support the current legal distinctions for marriage as a union between one man and one woman, exclusively, in Georgia;

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED, that our State Representatives, State Senator, and other State officials oppose any legislative proposals to change these legal distinctions to redefine marriage.
