NON-BINDING 2014 MAY 20 PRIMARY BALLOT QUESTIONS - RESULTS

1. Would you support reduced federal spending to reduce massive federal deficits?

YES - 4271 (94.53 %) NO - 247 (5.47 %)

2. Would you support federal tax increases to reduce massive federal deficits?

YES - 446 (9.91 %) NO - 4054 (90.09 %)

3. Would you support an amendment to the U.S. Constitution to limit a member of the U.S. Congress, whether House or Senate or combined, to a total of twelve (12) years of service?

YES - 3941 (87.68 %) NO - 554 (12.32 %)

4. Would you support an amendment to the U.S. Constitution to allow removal of a U.S. Senator by a two thirds vote of his or her state legislature?

YES - 3557 (80.88 %) NO - 841 (19.12 %)

5. Would you support a convention of state delegations per Article V of the U.S. Constitution, which could propose amendments to the U.S. Constitution, requiring three-fourths approval of the fifty states for adoption?

YES - 2923 (70.48 %) NO - 1224 (29.52 %)

6. Would you support a proposal to increase the current two-year terms for state senators to four-year terms?

YES - 1493 (33.40 %) NO - 2977 (66.60 %)

7. Would you support a higher state sales tax in exchange for the elimination of state income taxes?

YES - 3206 (71.39 %) NO - 1285 (28.61 %)

8. Would you support an amendment to the Georgia State Constitution to allow legal gambling on horse racing?

YES - 1956 (43.52 %) NO - 2538 (56.48 %)

"George H.W. Bush will get the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation's 'Profile in Courage' award, given to politicians for having done something of which liberals approve (in the case of the award to Gerald Ford for pardoning Richard Nixon, it was something they were able to prove long after the fact.) Bush will get it for breaking his promise not to raise taxes as president. Rewind the tape to appreciate just what it is being honored. Bush attacked tax cuts as 'voodoo economics' in his failed 1980 run for president. In his successful 1988 run he pledged in his convention speech to veto tax increases: 'Read my lips. No new taxes.' Then he signed a tax increase. Then, running for reelection in 1992, he apologized for it ('I regret it') and approved a party platform that called the tax increase 'recessionary' and urged its repeal. If he accepts the award, Bush will be taking his fifth position on this issue. Bush is a decent, civil, public-spirited, and in many respects exemplary man. His record on taxes is nothing to celebrate." (National Review)

RED SKELTON'S PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

As a schoolboy, one of Red Skelton's teachers explained the words and meaning of the Pledge of Allegiance to his class. Skelton later wrote down, and eventually recorded, his recollection of this lecture. It is followed by an observation of his own.

"I – Me; an individual; a committee of one.

Pledge – Dedicate all of my worldly goods to give without self-pity.

Allegiance – My love and devotion.

To the Flag – Our Standard; Old Glory; a symbol of Freedom; wherever she waves there is respect, because your loyalty has given her a dignity that shouts, 'Freedom is everybody's job.'

Of the United – That means that we have all come together. States of America – Individual communities that have united into forty-eight great states. Forty-eight individual communities with pride and dignity and purpose. All divided with imaginary boundaries, yet united to a common purpose, and that is love for country.

And to the Republic – A state in which sovereign power is invested in representatives chosen by the people to govern. And government is the people; and it's from the people to the leaders, not from the leaders to the people.

For which it stands

One Nation – meaning, so blessed by God.

Indivisible – Incapable of being divided.

With Liberty – Which is Freedom; the right of power to live one's own life, without threats, fear, or some sort of retaliation. And Justice – The principle, or qualities, of dealing fairly with

And Justice – The principle, or qualities, of dealing fairly wit others.

For All – which means, boys and girls, it's as much your country as it is mine.

And now, boys and girls, let me hear you recite the Pledge of Allegiance:

'I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic, for which it stands, one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.'

Since I was a small boy, two states have been added to our country, and two words have been added to the Pledge of Allegiance: Under God. Wouldn't it be a pity if someone said that is a prayer, and that would be eliminated from schools, too?"

"In a speech at his father's presidential library, Jeb Bush said that many illegal immigrants come to this country to better the lot of their families: 'It's an act of love.' So it often is, and enforcement should weigh more heavily on gangsters or terrorists than on the aspiring. But there are many kinds of love. Love of one's country includes honoring its laws; breaking the laws of a new country in order to get in it is a bad way to begin. There is also the love that citizens owe each other: Employers, from tech giants to farmers, might employ more of their fellow countrymen. The profit motive inclines them toward loose immigration laws. But 'the love of money,' as Saint Paul remarked, 'is a root of all kinds of evil.'" (National Review)
