WHY BALTIMORE REALLY BURNED

Liberals have been the biggest losers in the Baltimore Blame Game.

For a week they've been saying a lot of stupid things about the cause of the riots in Baltimore.

- They said the wild night of rioting, looting and burning by young black men was caused by Freddie Gray's death, which was supposedly yet another example of our country's racist policing methods even though three of the six cops were black.
- They said the rioting in Baltimore was caused by the inner-city's bad economy or the shortage of jobs that'll pay high school dropouts with no skills \$15 an hour.
- They said the rioting was caused by the mass incarceration of black men, the growing wage gap between rich and poor, Republican cuts in social spending, underfunded schools and the legacy of slavery.

Every knee-jerk liberal in America blamed the lawlessness that went on in Baltimore on something dead wrong. I bet some college professor on an NPR panel show blamed the riots on fracking.

Except for Juan Williams on Fox, I've not heard one liberal even hint that he understood the underlying cause of those riots in Baltimore.

It's the dysfunctional black family.

I didn't hear one liberal pundit point out that most of the young men who did the torching and rock throwing in Baltimore had no fathers present in their homes or even in their lives.

Everyone cheered that tough Baltimore mother, Toya Graham, when she slapped her 16-year-old son upside the head after she caught him wearing a mask and throwing rocks during the "protests."

She became everyone's "Mother of the Year" – for about 20 hours.

Then the jobless single mother of six was called a child abuser by liberals. She was even accused of justifying police brutality by Salon's resident logician, Joan Walsh.

Yes, Toya Graham did the right thing. And she accidentally did it on camera for the rest of the world to see and applaud.

But her actions should have begged some important questions in the liberal media, like, "Where the heck were all the other mothers in Baltimore's black community?"

Or, more important, "Where were the damn fathers?"

Why weren't a few older guys seen on TV protecting store fronts or swatting their rock-throwing sons and pulling them home by their collars?

They're permanently AWOL, that's why. And that's why so many young boys seek their male role models in drug gangs.

Too many American kids of all colors – about 20 million – are growing up without fathers in their homes.

But the black family has suffered most of all, and most of their blood is on the hands of liberal Democrats and big-government bureaucrats. Their do-good social welfare policies have penalized married, two-parent families and subsidized single mothers for five decades.

In 1960, five years before LBJ declared his doomed War on Poverty, one in four black kids was living in a house without their father present. Now the number is seven in 10. On top of that, the percentage of Americans living below the poverty rate is still what it was \$22 trillion federal dollars ago – 15 percent.

The problems resulting from broken black families are nothing new or unexpected.

In 1965 Daniel Patrick Moynihan, a brainy Democrat social scientist in the LBJ administration who became a U.S. Senator, warned us that the black family was breaking apart for a bunch of serious economic and social reasons.

Unemployment among black males was rising as increasing numbers of black women were going on welfare. He predicted those numbers would only get worse, and they did.

In what became known as "The Moynihan Report," he warned also that more and more broken black families were going to create serious problems for the black community and its culture, which they did.

Moynihan got lots of grief from his fellow liberals back then. And of course he was branded as a racist and an anti-feminist.

But he saw Toya Graham and her fatherless sons coming 50 years ago. If Moynihan were alive today, he might say they're a good symbol of why Baltimore went up in flames.

UNDER THE HEEL

Will pumps be all the rage in the new U.S. military? Universal Free Press reports that some male cadets have had to participate in walkathons – wearing women's high-heeled shoes. As part of the Army's mandatory Sexual Harassment/Assault Response and Prevention (SHARP) training, men in some units have been enjoined to wear red stilettos in a Walk a Mile in Her Shoes event. The stated goal: to "stop men's sexualized violence against women." Because nothing says "stop sexual violence" like men wearing high heels. Anyone who balks at cross-dressing faces a sharp kick in the rear, according to an Arizona ROTC cadet who bared his sole on Facebook. He posted: "If we miss it we can get a negative-counseling," and a "does-notsupport the SHARP/EO [Equal Opportunity] mission" reprimand on their record, a guaranteed career-killer. Army officials claim: "CadetCommand is currently reviewing how local ROTC units implemented their participation in these events designed to raise awareness on the issue of sexual assault." THE MOMENT I DECIDED I WAS IN LOVE WITH CAPITALISM

I was in China a few years ago with my oldest daughter. We were slightly off the beaten path walking through a village situated amongst several canals.

Keep in mind China is only recently emerging from being a third world country. The canals were beautiful, but they weren't like the upscale Venice or Vienna canals, lined with small one-and two-room stucco homes that sat right up against the water. They didn't have running water. Women were doing their wash in the canal.

I'm always interested in how people live. A long slow walk through a residential area gives you an opportunity to observe daily life in another part of the world.

The main thing I noticed was the floors. The homes were all jammed next to each other sharing common walls, and the exteriors looked pretty much the same. The backs were to the canal, and the front doors were right onto the street, with no yard or buffer zone between the homes and the street.

As the locals went about their business, going in and out of their homes, opening and closing their doors, I noticed that while most of the homes had dirt floors, a few had tile floors.

Walking further, I observed that the people with dirt floors opened and closed their doors quickly, getting in and out fast, with their heads down, as if to avoid letting anyone see inside their home. Those with tile floors were more eager to swing their doors open. They were more likely to be selling something like hand-carved wood pieces or fans. Some even had beauty and barbershops on their front room.

Ever the businessperson, I said to my daughter, "This would be a great place to be a tile salesperson." A few blocks later, we happened upon the Chinese version of Home Depot and I saw that I was right.

It's a metal building about as big as a suburban home. The roof is about 15 feet high, and one side of the building is completely open. It's crammed with light fixtures, hardware, lumber, and yes, plenty of tile.

Lined up around the edges were the Chinese contractors, small, slim men, with their three-wheel motorbikes with flatbeds on the back, buying supplies, and carting them off to improve someone's home.

There was an energy there; it was vibrant and alive.

The contractors were buying things, and selling them. They were making money, they were improving their lives; they were giving people pride in their homes.

That was the difference between the doors that were open, and those that were shut – pride. Other parts of China had felt grim and hopeless. But that hardware store was buzzing.

At that moment any ambiguity I had about capitalism was gone. I realized that making money, putting money into motion, creates energy.

Can you imagine a flourishing society without access to goods and services?

Those Chinese tile contractors were engaged in a noble cause. They were bringing the energy of commerce to their people.

Some people have abused capitalism. Some people have also abused families. But we don't suggest that families are a bad system. Human endeavors will always be fraught with errors.

The beauty of capitalism is that it gives people the power to control their own destiny and to add value to the lives of others.

I love people, and I love capitalism.

"These are glory days in Iran. The ayatollahs belong to the Shiite branch of Islam, down the centuries inferior in numbers and power to the Sunni branch. No longer. Financing and arming local Shiite militia and terrorist groups to do their bidding, the ayatollahs are already able to congratulate themselves on their rising influence in four Arab capitals, namely Bagdad, Beirut, Damascus, and Sanaa. UP IN SMOKE
