WHERE POVERTY COMES FROM (AND HOW TO DEFEAT IT)

Perhaps without meaning to, President Obama recently seemed to rebuke – wait for it – Jesus Christ.

Speaking at a "Poverty Summit," Obama remarked that "our job is to guard against cynicism and not buy into the idea that the poor will always be with us."

Of course it was Jesus who said, "Ye have the poor always with you." And anyone who's been paying attention for the last, oh, 2,000 years or so might conclude that He was merely stating a fact, not being "cynical," as the president charged.

That doesn't relieve us of our duty, clearly stated by Jesus elsewhere, to help the poor, which I take (in all fairness) to be Mr. Obama's main point. But the real problem isn't poverty itself so much as a cycle of poverty that traps generation after generation in economically depressed areas, with sub-standard housing and low-performing schools.

That doesn't have to happen. My grandparents were dirt poor, raising seven children on a farm in rural Indiana. Since he had to work all the time just to keep food on the table, my grandfather – one of the smartest men I've ever known – was unable to complete college. But he and my grandmother instilled a strong work ethic and a love of education in their kids, most of whom went on to earn college degrees and do well in life. Their grandchildren, by and large, have done even better.

That's what used to be known as The American dream. Simply put, it's freedom, specifically economic freedom, which coupled with hard work is the only force in the history of the world that has proved strong enough to break the cycle of poverty.

That cycle persists where excessive government regulation limits economic freedom and the appetite for hard work has been dulled by misguided government policies that subsidize sloth.

If you want to know why we still have poor people in this affluent nation, ask yourself two questions: 1) Who perpetuates those misguided policies, and 2) who stands to gain from keeping people poor? The answer to both questions is the same: welfare-state Democrats.

Consider the city of Baltimore, which has been run by Democrats since the 1960s – and where, during that time, family income has fallen steadily while the poverty rate has increased (this according to U.S. Census statistics).

Is that merely incompetence on the part of the city's elected Democrat leaders? Or is it something more insidious?

After all, Democrats boast loudly about being "the party of the poor." But doesn't that mean it's in the party's best interests to keep as many people poor as possible? After all, that's their base, the key to their continued electoral dominance.

President Obama was right about one thing, at least: We do have a responsibility to help the poor. And the best way to do that is to elect leaders who value individual freedom over nanny-state interventionism.

FREUDULENT

Those who want to join ISIS aren't bad guys: they're just misunderstood. So goes the reasoning at the FBI, which has decided to offer "counseling instead of handcuffs" for teenage suspects falling under the sway of the violent cult, according to The Wall Street Journal. "Nobody wants to see a 15-year-old kid go to jail if they don't have to," said an official. Nobody? I bet you could find a few Americans who'd rather see a plotting ISIS "kid" in iail before he detonates his backpack. But counseling bloodthirsty jihadists is "embraced by the Obama Administration" as part of "a broader initiative federal officials call countering violent extremism, or CVE." This new approach was designed to address "a hard truth" - the "FBI cannot effectively investigate all of the thousands of Americans who are believed to be interested in Islamic state." AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL UNDER FIRE FOR POLICY

Amnesty International, a human rights organization that has spent decades building a strong reputation standing against modern-day slavery, recently adopted a new policy supporting the global decriminalization of prostitution.

Several organizations that fight trafficking are putting pressure on Amnesty to rescind the policy. National Center on sexual Exploitation, Coalition Against trafficking, and celebrities such as Meryl Streep and Anne Hathaway argue that legalizing prostitution will only serve to normalize sex trafficking.

Statistics overwhelmingly favor keeping prostitution illegal. In every area and country where it is legal, violence against women drastically increases.

Lisa Thompson spoke on behalf of NCSE to OneNewsNow, AFA's e-news source. She said, "In most places where you have legal regimes of prostitution, there are panic buttons in the rooms for women to hit in case a buyer gets violent. It alerts security who can rush in to give them assistance. That is a dead giveaway to the violence involved in prostitution."

The last "Soldiers of Odin" to roam Scandinavia rowed longships and pillaged monasteries. But a group by that name has taken to patrolling streets in Finland and Norway, claiming that local law enforcement has proven itself inadequate to the task of protecting natives from the crime wave that has accompanied the surge of asylum-seekers arriving in Europe's northernmost nations. "Drugs are being sold, girls are being touched, there are assaults and violence," the group's Norwegian spokesman told Agence France-Presse. That vigilantes are taking to the streets in famously open-armed Scandinavia is alarming – and a reminder that, if Europe's official powers don't aim to control the Continent's refugee situation, far less savory elements will.
