To provide exposure for our primary candidates in contested GOP races, we will host a Candidate Forum on Monday, **May 2, 2016** at 7:00 PM in the Colleen Williams Theater of the Winder Cultural Arts Center. **This is not a debate.** Each candidate will be given a few minutes to explain why they are running for their chosen office, and what they hope to accomplish if elected. It will be a good opportunity to meet our candidates and possibly pick up signs and other materials.

Many thanks to all who attended the District Convention in Greensboro. Brian Burdette (Trump), Kirk Shook (Trump), and Bill Cowsert (Rubio) were elected as National Delegates. Mike D'Antonio (Trump), Janice Westmoreland (Trump), and Regina Quick (Rubio) were elected as National Alternates. We had 22 District Delegates and 4 District Alternates (elevated all 4) to reach 26 votes (100% allowed). We were the second largest county delegation behind Walton County with 29 total.

We had a great meeting last month with great attendance. We heard from Ginger Howard, candidate for GA RNC Committeewoman, and Caroline Power Evans, candidate for Barrow County Chief Magistrate. We also considered a proposed resolution regarding Parental Choice Education Accounts. This resolution was tabled.

Our next regular monthly meeting will be Monday, May 16, 2016 at 7:30 PM in the Winder Woman's Club. Our guest speakers will be Maria Strollo Zack, candidate for GA RNC Committeewoman, and State Rep. Regina Quick. We will also consider another proposed resolution concerning the National Popular Vote proposal. Please check the next page for the proposed wording of this resolution. PROPOSED RESOLUTION OPPOSING NATIONAL POPULAR VOTE

for consideration by the County Committee on May 16, 2016

WHEREAS, the current Electoral College system was established consistent with our representative republic type of government which provides protection for minority interests;

WHEREAS, Georgia HB 929 (SB 376) was pushed forward quickly and without proper vetting and discussion;

WHEREAS, such a change of this magnitude in the voting process should receive statewide review;

WHEREAS, this proposal is opposed by the RNC, Heritage Foundation, and Cato Institute;

WHEREAS, this is supported unanimously by Democrats, and the first states to sign onto this were the most liberal states;

WHEREAS, this is not in keeping with Republican principles;

WHEREAS, the NPV proposal is funded by Democrats;

WHEREAS, many Georgia Republicans made their voice heard and caused the National Popular Vote legislation to be tabled for the 2015 regular session of the Georgia General Assembly;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the County Committee of the Barrow County Republican Party urges our local state delegation to deny any advancement of this type of legislation in the future, and further urge the Governor of the State of Georgia to veto any legislation should it be able to pass; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Nathan deal, Lt. Gov. Casey Cagle, and House Speaker David Ralston for action.
