#### IS THE U.S. TURNING TO FASCISM?

"Progressives" have literally lost their collective mind since the election of Donald Trump, and it's easy to understand why.

After eight years of Obama, and anticipating an easy Hillary Clinton victory, they believed they were that close (holds thumb and forefinger a half-inch apart) to achieving their ultimate nirvana of complete control – getting to tell the rest of us not only what to do but what we're allowed to think.

That dream has withered on the vine as the left has watched Trump make inspired Cabinet appointees (like Jeff Sessions for attorney general) and contemplated his likely Supreme Court nominees. And so, in their psychotic rage, they are reduced to calling names, like "racist," "bigot," and "fascist."

Let's examine that last one for a moment. Whenever I hear a leftist say "fascist," I'm reminded of the line by the Indigo Montoya character in the movie "The Princess bride": "You keep using that word. I do not think it means what you think it means."

Generally, when the left calls someone a "fascist," what they're really saying is that they think he's a mean, scary man. Perhaps the word they're looking for is "tyrant" or maybe "despot."

So let's go with that. Is Donald Trump a potential tyrant? Well, yes, of course. All presidents are potential tyrants, as the founders understood very well. That's why they conceived the idea of separation of powers and wrote it into the U.S. Constitution.

Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright David Mamet put it this way in his delightful essay for the Village Voice back in 2008 titled "Why I'm no longer a brain-dead liberal."

"The Constitution, written by men with some experience of actual government, assumes that the chief executive will work to be king, the Parliament will scheme to see off the silverware, and the Judiciary will consider itself Olympian and do everything it can to much improve (destroy) the work of the other two branches. So the Constitution pits them against each other, in the attempt not to achieve stasis, but rather to allow for the constant corrections necessary to prevent one branch from getting too much power for too long."

Barack Obama is clearly Exhibit A. During his two terms, he frequently lamented the fact that the Constitution prevented him from enacting his full agenda, often threatened to bypass Congress altogether, and several times attempted to follow through on that threat. Fortunately, separation of powers kept him in check, at least to some extent.

No doubt the same will be true of Donald Trump. But to my leftist friends, I can promise this: No one will be more diligent in fighting any attempted unconstitutional overreach by President Trump than the true conservatives in Congress.

So, will Trump be a tyrant? The answer is no, although like his predecessor(s), he might very well try. But is he a fascist? We'll examine that question next week.

# PART II: IS THE UNITED STATES DESCENDING INTO FASCISM?

As I observed last week, when "progressives" use the term "fascist," they usually don't know what they're talking about. Most of the time, what they really mean is "totalitarian dictator."

But totalitarianism is not unique to fascism. Hitler was certainly a brutal dictator, but so were Stalin, Mao, Pol Pot, and that darling of the modern left, Fidel Castro – and they were all communists, not fascists.

Progressives also tend to associate fascism with extreme nationalism, but once again that doesn't compute. Sure, the Nazis fit that description – but has there ever been a more rabidly nationalistic bunch that the Soviets, except maybe the Chicoms?

Obviously, "fascism" doesn't mean what the left thinks it means. Instead, it's a very specific economic and political philosophy – a philosophy of the left, at that, despite progressive propaganda insisting it's some sort of far-right ideology. Remember, "Nazi" was short for "National Socialists."

I offered a more detailed explanation of fascism in a column I wrote a couple of years ago. Suffice it to say, for now, that fascism creates an unholy alliance between corporations and government, in which the former strive shamelessly to curry favor and the latter picks economic winners and losers.

Perhaps you recognize this model by its modern name: "crony capitalism," which is actually not capitalism at all. It's just fascism-light.

To those who worry the U.S. is descending into fascism, following the election of Donald Trump, I would respond that we've actually been there for some time – perhaps going back to George W. Bush and his proposed federal bailout of the automobile industry.

Of course it was Barack Obama who actually followed through on the bailout, as he constantly brags. If that isn't a case of the federal government picking economic winners and losers, I don't know what is – unless it's the feds blatant subsidizing of inefficient "green energy" companies – Solyndra, anybody? – while at the same time plotting the demise of the coal industry.

Or their collusion with textbook giant Pearson Education to create Common Core standards and materials, from which Pearson has profited mightily.

Or their seduction of the health insurance industry in a failed attempt to make Obamacare viable.

I could go on, but the real question is whether Trump will embrace similar policies. Unfortunately, his recent attempts to keep campaign promises by preventing companies from leaving the U.S. indicates some tendency in that direction.

However, I believe Trump is ultimately more pragmatic that ideologue. Unlike progressives, he is not laboring under the false Malthusian notion that the economy is finite – that for some to win, others have to lose. He understands that the best way to grow the economy is to grow all sectors rather than picking and choosing.

So while Trump's fascistic proclivities may bear watching, I believe in the long run we will have less crony capitalism under him than we did under either Obama or Bush.
