And the great abundance of U.S. production has brought down naturalgas prices to the point at which it makes good business sense for electric utilities to switch from relatively high-emission coal to relatively clean natural gas – which is why the United States has been able to reduce its greenhouse-gas emissions. It is sadly typical of Senator Warren's campaign that she should try to ban a success story. (*National Review*)

GIMME SHELTER

Well-heeled San Franciscans fighting to keep the bums away from their upscale waterfront neighborhood are out of luck.
