The International Olympic Committee has warned athletes that they are not to engage in political protests at the 2020 Summer Games in Tokyo. When it hosts the Winter Games in 2022, the Chinese Communist Party wants to present a sanitized image. Just as it wanted in 2008, when it hosted the Summer Games, just as it always wants. 2020 BARROW REPUBLICAN BALLOT QUESTIONS

Please note that the first 3 questions were placed by the GAGOP Executive Committee without our knowledge.

1. Should state education dollars follow the child to public, private, homeschooling, or other? (condensed)

2. Should voting in Republican primaries be limited to voters who have registered as Republicans?

3. Should candidates for Board of Education be required to declare their political party?

4. Do you support our Sheriff's Dept. participation in the Secured Communities Program, where all arrested persons are checked, and illegal aliens with criminal records are detained for federal immigration custody?

QUARANTINE THE LEFT!

For the first time in human history, experts have decided to quarantine the healthy. It's all for our own good, we're told, and for the greater good. But what if we're missing the Typhoid Mary (or Alexandria or Anderson) of American illnesses? What if it's actually liberals who are spreaders?

Let's look at the data, shall we?

CNN itself swerved into the truth two years ago when it admitted the media, the crown jewel of the left, is a vector: "Too Much Bad News Can Make you Sick." The aptly named Susanne Babbel, a psychotherapist "specializing in trauma recovery," explained what happens physically when relentlessly negative news media stresses people out: "Our physiology is triggered to release stress hormones like cortisol and adrenaline . . . Over time, when we experience this process again and again, our adrenal glands can become fatigued . . . lead[ing] to being tired in the morning, lack of restful sleep, anxiety and depression, as well as a multitude of other symptoms." Symptoms, according to Ms. Babbel, such as "headaches, muscle tension or pain, stomach problems, anxiety and sleep issues." For which there is no vaccine.

Last year, *Psychology Today* studied the question, "Are Conservatives healthier Than Liberals?" Turns out, research indicates that "greater personal responsibility may give conservatives a health advantage." And using logic and date and science, that means lesser personal responsibility puts libs at a health disadvantage. Because conservatives "regard themselves, rather than forces outside themselves, as being in charge of what they do," they engage in less risky behavior and make healthier decisions; the opposite is true for liberals. Yes, liberals are dangerous. Society clearly needs protection from them.

The American Journal of Political Science concluded that liberal political beliefs, not conservative ones, are "linked to psychoticism." And according to Psychological Reports, "State Resident Neuroticism Account for Life satisfaction Differences Between Conservatives and Liberal States of the USA." The science proves it: people in liberal states are far more neurotic and unhappy than people in conservative states. This higher neuroticism, says study author Stewart J.H. McCann, "is characterized by higher levels of . . . depression, tenseness, moodiness, angry hostility, impulsiveness, nervousness, anxiety, worry, emotional instability, and poor stress management."

These people are a menace, folks. All the academic models project that this virulent penetrance into the population cannot be contained without strict mitigation.

Look, I'm just following the facts and the data. The public health conclusion is inarguable. Keep America healthy: quarantine the left. It's science. (*Limbaugh Letter*)

Arrests of people crossing the southern border declined for the seventh consecutive month in December. The 32,800 arrests represent a decrease of more than 75 percent since the peak of the border crisis in May [2019]. Though border crossings tend to fall in the winter, the pace of this decline represents a victory for the Trump administration's new policy coordination with Mexico. At the urging of President Trump, Mexico has stepped up patrol of its southern border, deploying its national guard to prevent Central American migrants from entering the country. Further stemming the flow are the administration's new migrant Protection Protocols, which prevent migrants from remaining in the U.S. while they seek asylum. Based on that policy, more than 50,000 asylum seekers were returned to Mexico in 2019. Would-be migrants from the Northern Triangle countries of Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador have taken note. (National Review)

SCOTUS DECISION THREATENS ROE v. WADE

In an April 20 U.S. Supreme Court (SCOTUS) decision involving a Louisiana case unrelated to abortion, Justice Neil Gorsuch delivered a potential blow to the *Roe v. Wade* decision that established the precedent for legalized abortion in 1973.

The recent *Ramos v. Louisiana* case involved a man who had been convicted on a less-than-unanimous jury decision. The State of Louisiana argued based on the 1972 *Apodaca v. Oregon* case, which held that state courts (unlike federal courts) may convict a defendant by a less-than-unanimous verdict in a felony criminal case.

SCOTUS, however, cited the Sixth Amendment and ruled in favor of *Ramos*.

The court overturned the *Apodaca* ruling, arguing against *stare decisis* as a doctrine that Supreme Court opinions create binding precedent requiring all future courts to follow suit. Instead, Gorsuch called the *Apodaca* decision "admittedly mistaken."

"The monster takeaway is that Gorsuch's majority opinion has gutted *Roe v. Wade*," said Bryan Fischer, host of AFR's **Focal Point**. "The crying need is to get another abortion case to the Supreme Court and pray [to] God that the Court will once and for all obliterate that rotten-to-the-core opinion for time and eternity."

Black lives matter; of course, they do. But what about Black Lives, the movement? Like any large movement, it has a penumbra – at this moment, immense – of sympathizers, and a core of activists. Four years ago, the Frontier Center, a conservative opinion research and-messaging firm, interviewed a cohort of BLM activists and found a radical leftist sensibility, opposed to capitalism and patriarchy. Police were the immediate face of the enemy - "Yes, We Mean Literally Abolish the Police," as a recent New York Times op-ed headline put it – but American society as a whole is the ultimate target. Black Lives Matter's core message," the Frontier Center concluded, "is built upon, depends upon, and has as its ultimate goal the largest retelling of the American story as one of oppression and racism." It is both Occupy Wall Street by another name and a direct descendant of Sixties radicals-turned-academics. Protest peacefully if you will, but keep an eye on who wields the bullhorns. (National Review)

BEEZ NUTZ

Leftists are fighting each other over things you've never heard of. For instance, the battle between bee advocates and people who like almond milk. At *New York* magazine's culture website The Cut we learn that "Almond Milk Is Even More Evil Than You Thought." Because almond milk is super-popular as a "vegan milk alternative," it has become a burden for the planet. California beekeepers, whose hives are necessary to pollinate the almond orchards, sat almond farmers are killing their bees with pesticides. And overworking them. I kid you not.

Pollinating almonds is "especially demanding for bees," reports The Cut, "because they have to wake up from their annual period of winter dormancy one or two months earlier than usual to begin." The stress supposedly makes them more vulnerable to diseases. Organic beekeeper Patrick Pynes tells *The [UK] Guardian:* "The bees in the almond groves are being exploited and disrespected. They are in severe decline because our human relationship to them has become so destructive."

Actually, the bees have hit the jackpot – they've reached the highest rank in the liberal food chain: victims. Expect government cash to flow like milk and honey. (*Limbaugh Letter*)

Nikole Hannah-Jones and the New York Times did a hatchet job on the American Founding in the 1619 Project. The American Revolution? Mostly about slavery, never mind that the Revolution started in Massachusetts, or that slavery was banned in half the new nation decades before the British Parliament did anything about it. Lincoln? Mostly just a racist. Civil-rights laws? Passed without the help of white people, never mind that nearly everyone in Congress who voted for them was white. Preeminent historians objected to the fact-challenged history. A historian who was consulted said her warnings were ignored. After seven months of Hannah-Jones's crudely trashing her critics ("LOL. Right, because white historians have produced truly objective history"), she admitted she had erred, and a correction and lengthy editor's note were appended to the worst line in her essay. The Pulitzer Prize Committee thought that this unedifying spectacle deserved an award for commentary. A commentary it is, but not in a way that reflects well on the writer, the newspaper, or the award. (National Review)

STEAMING STREAMING

Turns out saving the earth has just gotten more complicated for libs, especially Millennials. *Deutsche Welle* has discovered that "collective internet traffic contributes enormously to climate change." Computers, smartphones, and iPads all require electricity – produced from fossil fuels. The amount of energy used by digital technology has even "surpassed the aerospace industry in terms of carbon emissions . . . While aviation's share of global CO2 emissions is . . . around 2.5 percent . . . nearly 4 percent of all Cos emissions can now be attributed to global data transfer and the necessary infrastructure."

The worst offender? Video traffic. "80 percent of all data transferred online is video data, with nearly 60 percent of that being online video, meaning streaming videos stored on a server and viewed remotely" on sites such as Netflix, YouTube, or Vimeo. So the upcoming projects that Barack and Michelle Obama are producing for Netflix will contribute to global warming, not only via the political hot air they generate, but due to the fossil fuels necessary to get it all online. Looks like Millennials should change their hookup line from "Netflix and chill" to "Netflix and grill the planet." (*Limbaugh Letter*)
