The Cato Institute published a national survey showing that selfcensorship and partisan cancellations are becoming the new normal. Some 62 percent of citizens say the polarized climate in 2020 prevents them from stating things they believe to be true lest they cause offense. In 2017, this number was 58 percent. More unsettling, among strong liberals, 50 percent say they support firing Trump donors, while 36 percent of strong conservatives say they support firing Biden donors. Among Republicans with postgraduate education, 60 percent feat they would lose their job if they expressed an unpopular political view. #### **DEAD IN THE WATER**

For decades, you've heard about all the species being wiped out due to your SUV. Add all sea life to the list. According to The [UK] Daily Mail, University of Exeter scientists claim oceans are on or at the tipping point of "anoxia," the state of being out of oxygen. This, they say, will lead to the extinction of every living creature in the oceans. The only solution, says lead researcher Sarah Baker, is to drastically cut carbon emissions. How did the Exeter team arrive at their five-alarm conclusion? By studying the Toarcian Oceanic Anoxia Event – which took place 183 million years ago. During the Jurassic Period, herds of fossil-fuel-spewing SUVs caused the oceans to warm, depleting sea oxygen and wiping out sea life for a million years. (Okay, I made up the part about the herds of SUVs, but the American lifestyle is the only explanation "scientists" these days give for ocean warming. I'd hypothesize it was a natural event - but there's no "consensus" for that.) Scientific conclusion: if we want to keep sushi restaurants open, taxpavers must continue to send billions to climate-change hucksters. (*Limbaugh Letter*)

Several times in the 1990s, the Norwegian Nobel Committee seemed poised to give the Nobel Peace Prize to Wei Jingsheng, the Chinese dissident. Each time, the Chinese government warned the Norwegian government that this had better not happen. (The committee is independent from the government, but foreign governments seldom understand this.) The committee also seemed poised to give the prize to Wang Dan, another Chinese dissident. Finally, in 2016, it awarded a third Chinese dissident, Liu Xiabo, the leader of the democracy movement in that country. Liu was a political prisoner at the time, and he would die that way, in 2017. Beijing retaliated against Oslo for the prize to Liu in various ways. The Chinese froze relations between the two countries. In recent days, the Chinese foreign minister, Wang Yi, has traveled to Oslo, warning the Norwegian government that the Nobel committee had better not award democracy protestors in Hong Kong. That is a good idea, now that Wang mentions it. So is a prize relating to the plight of Uyghur people. (*National Review*)
